Four Points real estate 3Q sales and days on market down

4th quarter looks promising

Third quarter, Four Points real estate had fewer listings and sales than a year ago but days on market were down showing demand for area homes. Four Points is known as River North on the Multiple Listing Service and includes River Place, Steiner Ranch, Grandview Hills, Westminster Glen, Glen Lake and parts of Long Canyon. Year over year, home sales in River North were down 8 percent from 166 in the third quarter of 2010 compared to 123 in the third quarter of 2011. New listings over that time were down 16 percent. "Market activity is still moving in a positive direction," said Gene Fruge, agent with HomeCity Real Estate. Historically the second quarter, April through June, is stronger from a listing and sales perspective than the third quarter, July through September. Fruge said it was to be expected, the third quarter this year saw 123 homes sold compared to 201 sold in the second quarter. This year homes sold 81 days more quickly on

average in the third quarter than the homes sold in the second quarter. Homes sold 41 days more quickly compared to the same period a year prior, Fruge said. "We have seen no slowing in the market or major public concern surrounding Steiner since the fires because it was so minimal and although changed the landscape of those few streets, did not change the look feel and landscape of Steiner Ranch as a whole. We are sincerely very lucky," said Brandy Finnessey, agent with HomeCity Real Estate and who lives in Steiner. Looking ahead, the fourth quarter of 2011 looks promising. "With all of the media attention being placed on Austin, one can only project that Q4 2011 and Q1 2012 will be nothing but encouraging," Fruge said. "Our forecast is hopeful, we basically won the beauty contest in articles from all over the nation." Kiplinger's Personal Finance ranked Austin the #1 Best City to Live In for The Next 10 Years. According to Ajilon Professional Staffing, Austin is the 2nd Best City to Find a Job. Milken Institute deemed Austin the 2nd Strongest Job Market in the Country. Investigation continues on the cause of Steiner fires

The investigation continues as to what caused the Labor Day Weekend fires that burned 23 homes, damaged others, and burned 162 acres in Steiner Ranch. The official cause has yet to be determined but Austin Energy electric power lines are still being investigated. The Travis County Fire Marshal's office continues to seek help from the community for more details. The Fire Marshal's Office hopes to hear from anyone who saw flames early on, around 4 p.m. on Sept. 4. They are asked to call the Travis County Fire Marshal office #854-4621. "We received several calls and a video after your news article on the Steiner Ranch fire (two weeks ago). We are still assessing the information we have received," said Hershel Lee, Fire Marshal Travis County Fire Marshal's Office. Electricity is being investigated as the possible cause of fire in Steiner. County investigators found damage on the overhead electrical wires directly above the likely point of origin, Lee said. "We will need to review engineering and lab reports after those are completed," he said. The fires cost an estimated \$10 million, fire officials reported.

Elementary class sizes affected by budget cuts

This year because of the budget cuts, there are fewer teachers in each Leander ISD building. The district is maximizing its class sizes to accommodate more students and fewer teachers. The LISD board approved the class size waiver compliance plan at its Sept. meeting. It applied to the Texas Education Agency for class size waivers at 19 elementary campuses including Laura Bush, Grandview Hills, River Ridge, River Place and Steiner Ranch. Firefighter's wife helps wildfire victims with photos

When the call for evacuation came to Steiner Ranch, residents grabbed what they could, with many reaching for photo albums and keepsake books. However, not every wildfire victim was so lucky. The Central Texas community is learning that many individuals escaped with only the clothes on their back and very little else. An East Texas photographer, who is also the wife of a career firefighter, is working to change that. Jennifer Stoehr, owner of Jennifer Marie Photography, somehow manages to find time to pursue her artistic passion between making school lunches and driving carpools for her four children. The wife of a firefighter in Henderson, Texas, Stoehr was touched by the stories emerging from recent East Texas wildfires and wanted to help. Stoehr contacted friend Heather Evans and the two photographers formed the Recapturing Memories Project, amassing a network of photographers across the state who have volunteered to create new memory books for wildfire victims. LISD Board learned of the district's debt management



At the Oct. 6 Leander ISD Board meeting, district administrators made a presentation to the School Board regarding debt management and long range enrollment growth planning. The total amount of outstanding and unpaid bonded indebtedness for LISD is \$1.28 billion. The district has issued a number of bonds through the years to pay for land, new schools, furnishings and equipment. To give some idea of the growth the school district has experienced, there were 10,669 students in the 1997-98 school year. The student population nearly tripled by 2009-10 to 30,321. By 2016-17, LISD is projected to have 41,135 students. The LISD Property Taxable Value History chart presented at the meeting shows the district went from less than \$2 billion in 1989 to \$13 billion in 2011. Currently administrators are looking at three growth strategy options: Business as Usual, Maximize Current Capacity, and Add Capacity to Existing Campuses. If the district decides to Maximize Current Capacity, some of the options would be to rezone, float teachers, reconfigure

grade levels, offer AM/PM sessions, and/or year round education. If the district chooses to add capacity to existing campuses, it will take into consideration core sizes of its schools: elementary - 800 stu-

Additional discussions will follow after LISD receives its annual demographic report and enrollment projections update later this month.

and backing into your driveway, turning off pilot lights and propane tanks, shutting off AC units, computer, etc.


- Go - Evacuation procedures

Overview of the new state assessment, STAAR

This year, students across the state will take the STAAR (State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness) exams, the state's new, more rigorous and complex testing program. LISD has been preparing for the STAAR for many months, and through innovative learning tools such as our Learning Model, Graduate Profile and Seven Student Learning Behaviors, we are working to ensure that our students are prepared for these difficult tests. Even though students won't take these exams until the spring, I want to give you an overview of some of the most important components of the STAAR assessments.

This year, students in third – ninth grades will take the STAAR exams, although it will eventually be administered to students in third – eleventh grades. The state-mandated

curriculum, the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS), will be the sole source for the STAAR assessments. Questions will require students to apply ideas, and thus, the STAAR exams will give students a deeper understanding of core subject areas — reading, writing, mathematics, science and social studies. Each year, the content of the STAAR exams will build upon knowledge and skills gained in previous years.

The STAAR exams are designed to determine if a student is prepared for the current grade level and the next grade level. These tests will also focus on college- and career-readiness, a new measure in our state assessments and one that we are excited to use in LISD. Under the STAAR tests' more complex structure, even students in elementary grades will be measured for col-

lege and career readiness standards. The exams will measure critical "readiness standards" and "supporting standards" necessary for building a solid foundation for college and life-long success.

As part of the state's focus to see that all students are on track to be college- and career-ready, the STAAR will be more rigorous and will require a higher level of student performance in order to meet certain benchmarks. At the same time, students will be assessed on more questions while demonstrating critical thinking and analysis.

Perhaps the most dramatic differences to the STAAR com-

pared to other testing systems are the End of Course Exams (EOCs). At the high school level, a total of 12 EOC assessments will replace grade-specific tests. Students will be required to take and meet the performance standard developed by the state on each EOC assessment to meet their graduation requirements, an important difference between the STAAR and the previous TAKS exams. The EOC exams will be required for graduation and will count towards 15 percent of the course grade. Additionally, the EOC exams will have an impact on the awarding of credits for the courses tested. Even though the STAAR is

just a few months away, we still face many unknowns at this point. For example, the district is currently reviewing how to best implement the rule that EOCs must count as 15 percent of a student's grade in the course. School districts are also waiting on clarification from the state about the special education accommodations policy. And we don't yet know how STAAR will impact state and federal accountability ratings in coming years.

Regardless of these challenges, as part of our continuous improvement culture, we are eager to begin this new testing system because we believe it will ultimately assist our district's efforts to close the achievement gap and reinforce our college- and career-readiness culture. LISD has been doing everything we can to ensure that our staff will be ready

for the STAAR. LISD curriculum specialists and teachers have thoroughly reviewed curriculum to ensure that standards assessed on STAAR will be taught prior to testing dates. And as more information is made available by the state, additional learning opportunities for teachers, students and parents will be planned.

While there are many details about the STAAR system that are still being finalized, we are confident that this new system will help improve the learning in classrooms, schools, districts and, ultimately, throughout the entire state. LISD will continue to communicate with families to help keep parents fully informed and aware of how the STAAR will impact our students.

Those plans were highlighted months ago at the Quinlan Crossing and Randalls groundbreaking. The word was then that the site will open Spring of 2012.

The new 60,000-square-foot Randalls will be part of the 137,681-square-foot, mixed-use Quinlan Crossing shopping center at the entrance of Steiner Ranch.

The supermarket will feature a Starbucks and there will be several stand along eateries in the center.

Quinlan Crossing then was in the process of signing leases with restaurants, a bank and other amenities, said Jim Reuter, Property Development Centers Vice President of Development. PDC is developing the project and is a subsidiary of Safeway.

I will keep digging and hopefully we will know something soon who our new neighbors will be.

on a Climate Controlled Storage Unit.

The City of Austin Environmental Board is reviewing the measure.

LISD is a highly desirable district to be in and more people move into the district each year. LISD administrators look at demographic trends to project which schools will get more students.

"In the past we would start off the classrooms with fewer students knowing within months those class sizes would increase... and then ask for waivers around January," Sopher said.

This year LISD is asking TEA sooner rather than later for waivers to exceed the 22-students-to-one-teacher ratio.

This does not mean we are overcrowded, Sopher said. There is a cap at LISD where K and 1st cannot exceed 22 students, 2nd cannot exceed 23

students, and 3rd - 4th cannot exceed 24 students.

At the beginning of each school year, Texas school districts are required to review class size enrollment to determine whether its class sizes for K-4th meet TEA requirements.

According to the review, LISD exceeds the 22-students-to-one-teacher ratio at:

- Laura Bush Elementary, 7 of 34 classes
- Grandview Hills Elementary, 3 of 21 classes
- River Place Elementary, 5 of 31 classes
- River Ridge Elementary, 7 of 31 classes
- Steiner Ranch Elementary, 8 of 28 classes

Some grade levels and some campuses do not have strong enough academic standings where more students in the classroom would not be conducive. This is not the case in Four Points.

"If a campus has seen academic success, we consider a waiver," Sopher said.

Four Points schools show academic success: LWB, River Place, River Ridge and Steiner Ranch all have exemplary ratings while Grandview has a recognized rating.

While 95 classes are over the TEA preferred ratio, 530 LISD kindergarten through 4th grade classes are under the 22-to-1 ratio.

area. These families then receive free prints and/or a high resolution disc of 10-20 portraits.

The program is open to all who were affected by wildfires in Steiner, Bastrop, Spicewood and more.

"Within 24 hours of starting the program, we had 50 photographers offering to help," said Stoehr of the overwhelming response to her social media posts for volunteers.

Austin photographer Deanna Roy received word of a displaced family's wish to remember what was left of their homesite as well as to start a new album from this point forward. Roy met the couple and their two daughters at the slab of what was once their Tahitian Village home before they relocate to California.

"It was one hundred times harder than I imagined it would be," Roy

said of the photo shoot. "The family had to drive through the fire to get out."

"Their mother wanted the girls to remember what it [Piney Woods site] looked like. I wanted to provide the context of why they moved suddenly when they were very young."

Photographers throughout the Lone Star State, have been willing to donate their time and talent for the Recapturing Memories Project. Stoehr and Evans require participating photographers to agree not to use the event to promote their own business.

"It's been crazy," said Stoehr. "I'm glad I've been able to get other photographers on board. It shows we can all pull together to help out."

The Four Points data supports an optimistic outlook as well. In the first week of Q4 2011, there are currently 241 actives in RN with 60 home sales pending or sold, which is already nearly 50 percent of what RN had all of last quarter, Fruge said.

"We have the opportunity to work with many relocation homebuyers from all over the nation. What we have learned is that it is all about families, conveniences and overall stable communities, and no other place embodies all of these attributes better than Four Points," Finnessey said.




